LAKE MANAGEMENT - Sam Holmgren

• An AIS strategy coordination team between Lake Management and KLF will be set up to be able to quickly handle issues, if AIS is discovered in the lake

HC COLA - Rolf Smeby

- Lake Finder Minnesota is the source through the DNR to find lots of information about Minnesota lakes.
 - Fish species, invasive species and lake regulations are features on the site
- 1 pound of phosphorus will breed 500 pounds of algae.
- The ice went out on May 9th
- At the end of May, the lake temperature 3 feet down was 73

KLF - Catherine Holmgren

• There are 2 funds that the KLF manages through St. Paul & Minnesota Community Foundation One is the granting fund, which the KLF uses to access money for grants The Perpetual fund is the largest fund

The KLF is limited to use about \$20,000 of this fund for grants

Money combined from both these funds can be used to fund grants that are proposed to the KLF

- If AIS was discovered in the lake, the KLF would have raise funds on an emergency basis to combat AIS
- With completion of the Potlatch land acquisition, the KLF goal of reaching 75% protected land in the Kabekona Watershed will be more than achieved

NEW BUSINESS
