Kabekona Lake Foundation – Looking for Ideas to Preserve our Lake

The KLF currently funds two major lake preservation projects:

1. The septic refund program. Last year the KLF Perpetual Fund paid approximately \$6,000 in refunds to property owners. Thanks to all who carefully monitor their septic systems. This is a huge benefit to preserving our lake.

2. Funding the inspection station and electronic monitoring device at the public landing. Last year the KLF Granting Fund contributed over \$15,000 to this important project that will hopefully

If you've taken your boat out of Kabekona don't forget about the free decontamination station in P a r k R a p i d s (a p p o i n t m e n t s 218-252-6738 or mndnr.gov/decon). Remember, the rules apply to canoes, kayaks, and sailboats, too.

LAKE MANAGEMENT TEAM

When I was a teenager, the hottest arcade game at the 7-Hi Shopping Center in

Minnetonka was the now-iconic alien shoot-'em-up called "Space Invaders." While most of us have been under siege with messaging about invading Aquatic Invasive Species like Zebra Mussels and Eurasian Milfoil, it is Starry Stonewort, recently discovered in Leech Lake's Steamboat Bay, that could unleash the most destruction on Lake Kabekona. It spreads quickly and overwhelms native species. It forms massive mats that clutter the lake surface, obstruct fish-spawning habitat, and hinder recreational enjoyment of the lake.

Each August the U of M conducts a statewide educational outreach called "Starry Trek." The program teaches how to identify Starry Stonewort and includes a field trip to a local lake where participants learn how to gather samples for testing. If you are interested in participating, please email me at <u>sam.holmgren@icloud.com</u> for more about the program.

The KLA Lake Management Committee and HC COLA are always working on ways to bolster our AIS prevention techniques and monitor the lake for clues that trouble is lurking. Currently about 20 Kabekona residents participate in a monitoring program that checks for Zebra Mussel infestation.

Let's continue to prevent AIS in Lake Kabekona!
